Sierra Leone

West Africa

The civil war in Sierra Leone has rendered a devastating effect on the country. It has destroyed many families, homes and businesses. An overwhelming number of men (who had been the sole breadwinners of their families) have been incapacitated due to war injuries and therefore unable to provide for their families. Because of this changing dynamic, women (who for the most part had been unemployed) are now seeking means of employment to sustain their families. In March 2007, Cole Stevens Salon & Day Spa went to Sierra Leone, West Africa and conducted a four day beauty curriculum called "Beauty with a Purpose". This program helped to provide a way out of poverty for at least 300 families by teaching cosmetology skills to women who previously had lacked the skills to obtain gainful employment or start their own businesses. The Cole Stevens Team will continue to travel to Sierra Leone annually to help women develop professional cosmetology skills.
